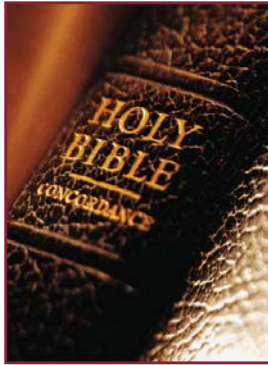

A Word From the Heart

The recent “home” going of Elizabeth Elliot was not unexpected but the void her life has left will not be easily filled. Her understanding of devotion to Christ and Christian service will not soon be replaced by someone else. She wrote 24 books and gave to us a rich source of reading material on the lives of dedicated Christian servants. One of her most impressive books was “Through Gates of Splendor”. This was a book that made a deep lasting impact in the lives of young missionary enthusiasts, who were challenged by the unwavering dedication of five highly qualified young men. These men were just beginning what they

thought of as a lifelong work among primitive people. Bitterness was restrained by Elizabeth, and a life of faith was held up as a normal life of dedication to Christian service rather than that of just a few people who had excessive zeal to risk all for Jesus Christ. The following years, she continued to write books on God’s work among the then called Aucas of Ecuador. Because of her experience and her writings she was often invited to address conferences of young people eager to hear about how they too might know God’s calling and its cost. Her remarkable ability to address missions in changing times did cause some to reject her ideas on discipline, purity and the missionary calling. Her views on short term mission trips were not the accepted view of a more modern idea of testing our calling to lifelong service among people in a distant and hostile environment. She

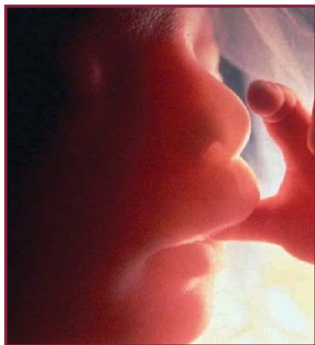
handled the question and answer sessions with ease and in consideration of the new influences on missionary thinking. She was neither an inflexible nor an unchanging old school missionary. Her books on purity, women, and marriage could upset notions on current biblical understanding. Was she old fashioned in these so called enlightened times? Or was it that she realized current thought was more influenced by the changing attitude of a more self-centered way of thinking?

Here are a few examples of current thoughts that she understood were more a hindrance to a lifelong dedication to missionary service.

1. One should visit a foreign mission station to see if they might like it.
2. Only do what I am trained to do and refuse to be flexible and do the task at hand.
3. It is not a life time commitment but is ok until I no longer feel fulfilled.
4. Fulfillment and success is to be the only goal of Christian service.

I am sure that I did not read all of her 24 books but was influenced by those I read. I enjoyed “A chance to Die “ and was moved to memorize many of Amy Carmichael’s poems that challenged us to serve, endure, and always prefer God’s will. “No Graven Image “ was, I believe, her only novel. It was controversial and most likely her least popular book. It seems one either loves or hates it. Had I read it before going to Colombia, I might have thought Margaret Sparhawk, the main character, was bitter and doubting God’s love and leading. I was fortunate to have read it while on my first leave and thought it a precise description of missionary life and the discouragement it could ultimately produce. Thanks to Elizabeth Elliot for her legacy of a life of dedication and uncompromising faith.

Body Parts for Sale: I Shudder to think what happened to my babies, says Alveda King

I was distracted, the duress was debilitating. The staff urged me to quickly finish my paperwork so that the procedure could take place.”

This is a common scenario. There is little time to consider what is happening; what will happen to the bodies of the mother and her baby. This is why a 48 hour waiting period between the consultation and procedure can be so key.

The Silent No More Awareness Campaign shares important details regarding the lack of disclosure a woman experiences during the “procedure” that can result in having her baby’s body parts harvested.

The issue of abortion is being danced around by media as this body part debacle unfolds. As all unravels, we will discover that there are heinous tentacles from a Three Headed Monster that are at the core of the assault on humanity.

It won’t be the media who helps heal the hearts and wombs of women. It will be prayer; as we see in this impassioned plea from a young woman.

Federal Government Agency Continues to Illegally Fund Abortion; Receives Golden Fleece

Office of Population Affairs funds Planned Parenthood despite the gruesome video of PP 's staff

ALEXANDRIA, VA - Citizens for the Republic today announced that this week's Golden Fleece Award is presented to the Office of Population Affairs for sending hundreds of millions of dollars to Planned Parenthood as the group's sale of aborted baby parts is revealed in a revolting video.

As reported by The Washington Post, a video released Tuesday shows a Planned Parenthood official discussing the trade of fetal tissue from aborted babies. The official featured, Mary Gatter, Medical Director for Planned Parenthood Pasadena and San Gabriel Valley, joked that she "want(s) a Lamborghini," implying the organs of dead babies will fund this expenditure. While delivering this fetal tissue is (shockingly) federally sanctioned, the sale of this tissue is illegal. With the revelations presented in this video, it is absurd that the Office of Population Affairs is still funding these amoral procedures, and likely bankrolling illegal acts.

"This horrifying video should provide a much needed wakeup call to the faction of Americans who still believe Planned Parenthood is in any way connected to women's 'health'," said Diana Banister, Executive Di-

rector of Citizens for the Republic.

"This heinous organization is about profit, and the Faustian federal government has made Americans complicit in this immoral activity. It's absolutely abhorrent that the Office of Population Affairs has and continues to fund these illicit, felonious acts.

"Several governors across the country have defunded Planned Parenthood in their respective states. It's time for the federal government to step-up, reUlll a modicum of morality to our country, and completely defund this malevolent group."

The Golden Fleece Award was first established by former Sen. William Proxmire (D-WI) in 1973 to call attention to a government official or agency that egregiously wastes the taxpayers' money. CFTR announces a new winner each week.

Kansas governor protects pastors from lawsuits over gay weddings

Kansas Gov. Sam Brownback issued an executive order today protecting clergy and churches from lawsuits over their refusal to participate in same-sex marriages.

"We have a duty to govern and to govern in accordance with the Constitution as it has been determined by the Supreme Court decision," Brownback said in a prepared statement. "We also recognize that religious liberty is at the heart of who we are as Kansans and Americans, and should be protected. The Kansas Bill of Rights affirms the right to worship according to 'dictates of conscience'

and further protects against any infringement of that right. Today's Executive Order protects

Kansas clergy and religious organizations from being forced to participate in activities that violate their sincerely and deeply held beliefs."



Kansas isn't the only state to adopt protections for clergy after the Supreme Court legalized same-sex marriage. Last week, Texas Gov. Greg Abbott signed a bill passed by the legislature at the end of its session to shield pastors from lawsuits. Oklahoma enacted a similar measure May 1, and Tennessee legislators are considering one. And Louisiana Gov. Bobby Jindal issued his own executive order providing protections to pastors after lawmakers in his state failed to pass a proposed bill.

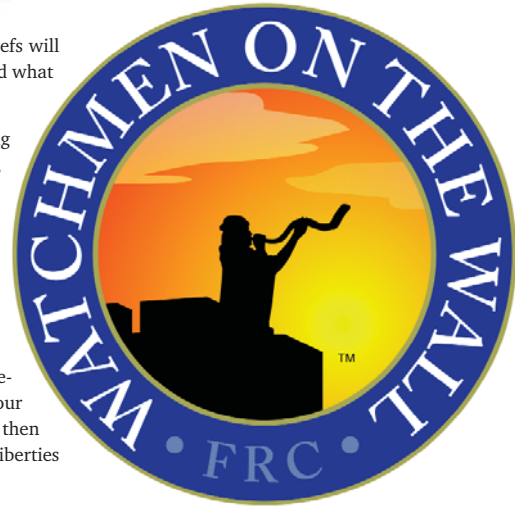


The Court's demand is clear; your ability to live your life according to historic Christian beliefs will be limited to your church and your home. But the truth is even how you live in your home and what you teach your children is going to be impacted.

The sexual revolutionaries will become even more aggressive to advance their agenda by going after the tax-exempt status of religious nonprofits and the accreditation of religious schools, colleges and universities. They will also redouble their efforts to make the workplace a place of persecution for those who adhere to a biblically-based, historically-supported view of marriage.

"Despite the challenges we now face, let me assure you: I believe we can win. But to win, by God's grace, we must stand against all that these enemies of faith will throw at us. This is our moment in our nation's history for courage.

Our first freedom – religious freedom – is essential and must be preserved. All the other freedoms that ALL Americans enjoy hinge on religious freedom. If we are not courageous in our defense of the First Amendment's guarantee of the freedom to live according to our beliefs, then the freedom of speech, freedom of association, freedom to keep and bear arms, and all the liberties we take for granted are in danger of also being taken away by the federal government.



Preachers of Habit

Redefining marriage in the courts may not have been difficult, but persuading Americans to accept it is another story entirely. Their supporters may be cheering the Supreme Court now, but those five blackrobed lawyers may also be responsible for something else: America's spiritual revival. In church after church, the story is the same -- pastors preaching powerful sermons on God's design for marriage and urging their Rev. Mil. lel-, MI:. Hebron Missionally Baptist Church, Houston congregations to accept no substitutes.

If what's happening in the pews of America is any indication, the Supreme Court didn't weaken people's resolve -- it strengthened it. And if liberals truly believe that evangelicals are the "only cultural holdouts" on marriage, they're about to find out how wrong they are. Across denominations, ethnicities, and political parties, there's a growing outrage over the Court's presumption -- and the President's betrayal.

In African-American churches, the White House's anti-marriage campaign is particularly infuriating. "Ask me if I regret it," Daryl Fisher told a Los Angeles Times reporter about voting for Obama. "I do. If I could take it back, I would -- on this issue alone. We expect him to rule this nation based on the beliefs in this book," he said holding up the Bible. Like most of the congregation at Mt. Hebron Missionary Baptist Church, he was appalled by the President's rainbow light show on the people's house. "It's painful as a Christian," Fisher shook his head, "to see the leadership -- our President -- has not taken God into consideration."

They also resent the fact that this White House continues to link marriage to the civil rights debate. There is "no connection whatsoever," Fisher pointed out. Others, like church administrator Sylvia Sims, says she used to be a straight-ticket Democratic voter. Not anymore. "It's going to make us more diligent as Christian voters," the group agreed. "[We'll have] to know where you stand on this issue." Unfortunately, Sims explains, the church has no one to blame but itself for the culture's decline. "We should have spoken up sooner." But, like a growing number of congregations, they're speaking up now. "We stand now joined with a unified voice as watchmen on the wall of history," Rev. Miller made clear, "to call for a redirection and recommitment to Christian virtues and Christian morals."

Unified is right. From Catholic parishes to Jewish synagogues, the faith community is showing liberals what true diversity looks like. In Brentwood, Tennessee, Pastor Mike Easley isn't known for wading into politics. But yesterday, he preached from Genesis 19 and said that if lawsuits come for their views on sexuality and marriage -- so be it. The people in the pews stood up in thunderous applause.

In Tyler, Texas, the local diocese was put on notice: no Catholic facility or employee of the church would participate "in any way" in same-sex marriage. Bishop Joseph Strickland left no doubt where he stands after a Supreme Court ruling that he calls "unjust and immoral." It is our "duty," he informed his parishes, "to clearly and emphatically oppose it ... In spite of the decision by the Supreme Court, there are absolutely no grounds for considering unions between two persons of the same sex to be in any way similar to God's plan for marriage and the family."

On Freedom, Democrats or Democritics?

The same party that kicked God out of their platform wants to kick Him out of U.S. insurance policies too. Everyone from Barry Lynn to Sen. Tammy Baldwin (D-Wisc.) is deploying their troops to a new battlefield: the church. Already, congregations are trying to prepare themselves for the storms ahead -- with many, National Review points out, frantically calling insurance companies to see what kind of coverage they have if they're sued for not performing same-sex "weddings."

The answer is: not much. "Churches, like virtually every functioning corporation, protect against liability risks and the potentially ruinous costs of litigation through liability insurance. With same-sex marriage now recognized as a constitutional right -- and with news of [the Kleins' \$135,000 punishment]... pastors are reaching out to insurance companies to make sure they're covered." Unfortunately for them, David French writes, they aren't. "In other words: churches, you're on your own."



On one hand, the Left is trying to cripple churches' ability to fight back, and on the other, they're trying to strip away protections for the everyday believer. Like most liberals, DNC Chair Debbie Wasserman-Schultz isn't hiding the fact that religious liberty is next on her kill list, especially for individual Americans. "I think [our country] made the distinction between protecting the First Amendment rights for religious organizations or religiously-affiliated organizations and being able to discriminate, broadly, simply because of one individual who owns a business and their own values and their being able to impose those values on either their employers or their customers," she told CBN's David Brody.

Once again, liberals are setting up the faulty argument that religious exercise must be confined to institutions -- not individuals. As any constitutional scholar would tell you, that's a deliberate distortion of the First Amendment! It's like saying the Second Amendment only applies in gun clubs. The reality is, and the Founders understood, religious liberty is a fundamental human freedom. In fact, it was Eleanor Roosevelt -- from Wasserman-Schultz's own party -- who chaired the drafting committee of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in 1948. And it could not be more clear: "[E]veryone has the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion; this right includes freedom to change his religion or belief, and freedom, either alone or in community with others and in public or private, to manifest his religion or belief in teaching, practice, worship and observance."

What's happened to the Democratic Party? After 70 years, there's nothing "democratic" about it!

HOUSTON PASTOR FIGHTS MAYOR'S SERMON GRAB



After four years of forcing her extreme agenda on the city, Houston's Mayor Annise Parker may have finally picked a fight she's bound to regret. Five months after bullying her

Pastor Steve Riggle, founder of the Grace Community Church, boldly opposed this retribution, not only because it violated the First Amendment protections of religious freedom, but because the mayor's actions were a blatant abuse of power used to subvert Houston's referendum process.

It is very important that we stand with Pastor Riggle and the other "Houston 5" today. If we don't, they may be coming after your pastor tomorrow.

Charleston Pastors Pray for Lasting Unity

Across racial and denominational lines, clergy band together to move people past the 'stasis' of the city's history of division

More than two weeks after Rev. Clementa Pinckney and eight of his parishioners were shot to death in the basement of Emanuel AME Church in downtown Charleston, S.C., questions hang heavy in the humidity of this Southern coastal city: What will sustain the beautiful display of unity among races visible in the shooting's aftermath? How do churches keep racial reconciliation on the street and not cloistered behind church walls as a relic to be brought out after the next crisis?

"People want to engage and grieve, but there is a lot that works against lasting change," said Bishop Mark Lawrence of the Anglican Diocese of South Carolina. "People want to get back

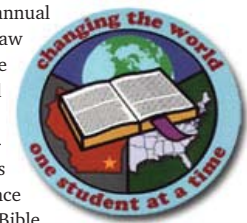
to what they perceive as normal as quickly as possible."

It's that "stasis," as Lawrence calls it, that consumed the prayers of close to a hundred Charleston-area pastors who gathered June 30 next door to Mother Emanuel AME at Citadel Square Baptist Church. Clergy of various denominations and races—some in clerical attire and others in blue jeans, some women but mostly men—joined hands in small groups to pray for personal repentance and that the city would turn from divisions hindering the gospel message.

They prayed for revival and reconciliation, and for the Holy Spirit to refresh the churches to bring people together and communicate a "multi-ethnic" presentation of the gospel that speaks to all people.

MILWAUKEE, WI - I started out in college with the plan of getting a job in advertising, but one night while studying in the library I started rethinking my career path. I decided my plan was not big enough; making money was not something I could commit my whole life to. Through meeting Jesus Christ my life had been forever changed, and I wanted to be a part of what God was doing to reach others who were lost.

For years after this decision to serve Christ, I tried to start working as a missionary, but God always had something else for me—manage this store, get married, raise children. Together with my wife Sharon, the dream of becoming missionaries continued to grow, and as we grew our lives together the tug of missions work never left our hearts. We could never shake the sense that God had called us to be involved in missions in some way - someday. Then, in August 2014 that chance finally came through Wycliffe Bible Translators.

Wycliffe's founder, William C Townsend said, "The greatest missionary is the Bible in the mother tongue. It needs no furlough and is never considered a foreigner." In our world today there are approximately 1,860 language groups representing over 180 million people still waiting to receive a Bible they can understand. Wycliffe aims to have a Bible translation program for every language needing one by the year 2025. Now that's a goal worth giving your life to.

Many missionaries out on the field right now are nearing retirement. When you add to this the enormous task ahead in reaching these last language groups, the need for more workers - more missionaries—becomes clear. There is a great need for an entire new generation of

career missionaries who will carry the gospel to those who have never heard. We believe God is doing a special work on college campuses in the United States. The impact these college students can have on those around the world who have never heard of Jesus Christ is incalculable.

College students and other Christians today need a fresh vision for what God is doing to reach the world. As Proverbs 29:18 says, "Where there is no vision, the people perish." Today Bible translation work is progressing at a pace never before seen, and because of technology and the ability to leverage previous translation experience, the accuracy and quality is also improving.

The missionary Francis Xavier once declared, "Tell the students to give up their small ambitions and come eastward and preach the gospel of Christ." Like I was in my college days, today's college students are asking God how He can use them to make a difference and change the world. Sharon and I want to be a part of this by praying, encouraging and equipping other believers to find their place in the Great Commission.

The job assignment Wycliffe has given us is to work on their U.S. Mobilization Team. As a couple we could, of course, go overseas ourselves and fill one position on the mission field. Instead, Wycliffe has asked us to pray and to help mobilize as many people as we can to join the task of bringing God's Word to the Bibleless people of the world. When God puts it into the heart of a person to serve with Wycliffe as a missionary, Sharon and I come alongside them. We pray for, encourage and provide resources to help that missionary candidate move from here to there.



Really no one can recruit another person; it's God who calls missionaries. It will always be Him who puts it into the hearts of people to serve through Wycliffe, but it is a great joy to us to be a small link in the chain that God is using to bring the Word of God to those who need it. Translation work really does take a team.

There are, of course, Bible translators, linguists, literacy specialists but there is also a long chain of people involved in getting God's Word to those who have no access to it. There are those who encourage, pray and give financially. There are teachers, pilots, IT professionals and managers all playing a vital part in the ministry of carrying the Gospel to those who have never heard it. We have joined this team, and are so excited about helping others find their unique place with Wycliffe.

Currently, Sharon and I are still considered pre-field, which means we are trusting God to raise the finances necessary to make a full transition to the mobilization team. Taking God at His Word: Graham Twins Lead Teams of International Missionaries with Cru

Local twins epitomize the vision of Cru: turning lost students into Christ-centered laborers.

Since its 1951 inception at UCLA, Cru (formerly Campus Crusade for Christ) has impacted college students worldwide. Two cases are recent UW grads Josh and Andrew Graham.

Coming into college, these brothers claimed to be a caring community passionate about Christians. Growing up, church attendance was the norm, but this cYinec:ting people to Jesus Christ hardly masked the brokenness of a drug addicted father, a quadriplegic grandpa, and years of artificial fulfillment. They excelled in church youth groups, school, and athletics, but simply had not experienced the true purpose of life; relationship with Almighty God.

While at Madison though, God brought them into contact with students and staff from Cru who challenged them to make Jesus not only their Savior, but also their Lord. This charge



led them to pursue evangelistic mission trips in Miami and East Asia, and lead with Cru at Madison, helping new believers grow through leading small group bible studies, discipleship (spiritually mentoring younger men) and leading peers to creatively and caringly share Christ with the Madison campus community.

Having graduated, they're now taking the Great Commission literally by exploring vocational ministry through Cru's international internship program known as STINT. In so doing, Andrew will be spending the next year with a team of 4 missionaries in Arusha, Tanzania and Josh will be with a team of 7 missionaries headed to a secure location in East Asia.

If you were to talk to them, it wouldn't take long for their missional hearts to surface. Specifically, they've developed a God-given vision for discipleship. As they purposed in their hearts to go, the Lord quickly led them to pray He would pro-

vide each STINTER 3-5 disciples that they could truly share their lives with, just like Jesus and Paul did with their followers. Subsequently, they have seen the Lord affirm His calling when they were asked by Cru's Global Missions Directors to lead their teams! The hope is that these disciples would be the foundation upon which God builds these self-sustaining spiritual movements.

Josh and Andrew are eager to be God's newest hands and feet, and are currently in the process of raising their financial support to see this vision realized. 3 Tbsp. sugar

3 Tbsp. butter, melted

1 container (1.75qt. - 2qt.) strawberry
ice cream, slightly softened

8 oz. frozen whipped topping, thawed

1/2 c. chocolate syrup

Sprinkles, optional

Combine cracker crumbs, sugar and butter; divide
between 2 buttered 9-inch pie pans. Pat crumbs in
bottom and sides of pans. Set aside. Use half of the
ice cream for each pie. Drizzle each pie with half of
the chocolate syrup; then spread half of the whipped
topping on each pie. Add sprinkles, if desired. Freeze
until firm, about 6 hours. Cover and wrap securely.
Remove from freezer 10 minutes before serving.

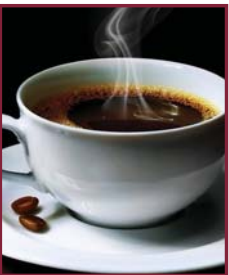

North Dakota High Schoolers Win Bid to Start Pro-Life Clubs

Administrators for a North Dakota school district approved two Students for Life of America (SFLA) high school clubs this week after initially denying their applications.

The approval followed a demand letter sent by the Thomas Moore Society (TMS) on behalf of SFLA and high school students Katie McPherson and Brigid O'Keefe. TMS sent the letter to Superintendent Jeff Schatz, outlining how the denial violated the federal Equal Access Act and the First Amendment.

"We are glad that the district and high school administrators in Fargo have recognized the First Amendment rights of all students, including pro-life students," said Jocelyn Floyd, Thomas Moore Society associate counsel. "High-schoolers do not lose their right to form clubs and speak their message just because they are pro-life. Rather, they should be encouraged to add their voices to the marketplace of ideas."



McPherson attempted to found an SFLA club at Davies High School in September, and O'Keefe attempted to found a club at Fargo North High School in February. Both girls met administrative opposition. After they appealed, the district decided to classify pro-life clubs as "outside agencies" under a no-solicitation policy, meaning the clubs couldn't use the school name in club titles, host events, or meet on campus.

The Davies Teens for Life club has already held its first meeting, and the Spartans for Life club will meet next week.

SFLA president Kristan Hawkins hopes McPherson's and O'Keefe's success will encourage other high school students to found pro-life clubs.

"It is often in high school that the first fires of pro-life activism are kindled," she said. "Brigid and Katie are great examples of courage, standing up for their pro-life beliefs, and fighting to protect the rights of the pre-born."

WINNING FOR RELIGIOUS FREEDOM IN THE STATES

The past months have seen a fierce "win some, lose some" contest for religious freedom in the states. A loss: Indiana's governor and legislature caved in to pressure by big business and left-wing activists and turned their Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA) into a law that actually hurts the cause of religious freedom.

But the same week, Arkansas resisted similar pressure and passed a RFRA.

And Louisiana, which already has a RFRA, took additional measures to protect religious freedom when Gov. Bobby Jindal issued an executive order instituting the provisions of the Marriage and Religious Freedom Act which was blocked in a House Committee by Republicans and gay activists.

PAIN-CAPABLE UNBORN CHILD PROTECTION ACT

On May 13, thanks to the hard work of Rep. Trent Franks (R-Ariz.), Chris Smith (R-N.J.) and others, the new Republican majority with overwhelming support (242-183) passed the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act (H.R.36). This bill would prohibit abortions after the fifth month of pregnancy, when unborn babies feel excruciating pain, ending the suffering of more than 13,000 innocent children a year. FRC Action will continue to push this legislation forward in the Senate.



Court Rejects Pharmacists' Right of Conscience

Ninth Circuit rules that family-owned pharmacy must violate their faith

Washington, D.C. - Today, in *Stormans v. Wiesman*, the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals upheld controversial Washington state regulations that require a family-owned pharmacy and two individual pharmacists to dispense the morning-after and week-after pills in violation of their religious beliefs. The Washington regulations go further than regulations in any other state in forcing pharmacists to violate their religious beliefs. "Today's decision is unfortunate," said Luke Godrich, Deputy General Counsel of the Becket Fund for Religious Liberty. "The government has no business punishing citizens solely because of their religious beliefs. The pharmacists in this case willingly refer patients to over 30 pharmacies that stock the morning-after pill within a five mile radius, and no patient has ever been denied timely access to any drug. The pharmacists' practices are also supported by the American Pharmacists Association and are legal in every other state."

Thou my whisper'd plaint hast heard."

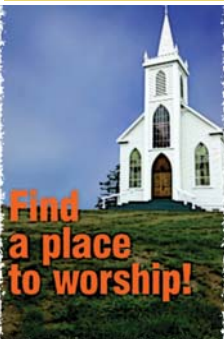
