This year, our guest speaker is Kelly Wright of FOX News. He is a well-respected reporter and viewed weekly as the co-host of America's News Headquarters on Saturdays. Kelly previously served as a co-host on Fox & Friends Weekend.



Most recently, Kelly was inducted into the Martin Luther King, Jr. Board of Sponsors at Morehouse College for his "Beyond the Dream" series. Through the years, he has reported on numerous high profile newsmakers and events including: John Gotti, Amy Fisher, the Howard Beach and Bensonhurst murder trials and the 1989 Central Park jogger rape case and conducted exclusive interviews with Laura Bush and OJ Simpson.

He began his journalism career in 1977 while serving in the United States Army. Kelly has received numerous awards including two local Emmy Awards for his developing, reporting, and co-producing a documentary and news series on the transatlantic slave trade.

Kelly is blessed with many talents and will be sharing his unique testimony at the banquet entitled: "A Time for Triumph." His books and CD's will be available for purchase.

Also on our program as Emcee is Fox 6 News reporter and anchor, Beverly Taylor. At the 2010 Fall Banquet, Beverly was ECFA's guest speaker and blessed all in attendance who heard her story. In May this year, Beverly did a special feature story about two ECFA families that aired Mother's Day evening on the Fox 6 News. (That video clip can be viewed on our website). Beverly has had some significant life changes and blessings these past five years she will hopefully share.

For 18 years, Beverly Taylor has been welcomed in homes throughout southeastern Wisconsin. Whether she is on assignment reporting the next Breaking News story, or

anchoring a newscast, Beverly's velvety voice, gentle spirit, integrity, and sincerity are distinctive traits that identify her on FOX 6.

Beverly graduated from the University of Tennessee with a major in Broadcasting. On May 17, 2015, she earned



her Master's Degree in Dispute Resolution from Marquette. She has been honored with several awards as a reporter and on April 24, 2015, received this year's United States Attorney's Office National Crime Victims' Rights Award. The award was in recognition of her "dedicated,

tireless, focused and productive work in advancing and protecting the rights of crime victims." She has done a number of stories that have increased awareness of the human trafficking problem in our area.

In the past, she hosted a weekly segment called *Adoption Connection* and enjoyed interacting with children in foster care awaiting their forever homes. In her spare time, Beverly enjoys reading and watching movies "with my boys."

She and her husband, Julian, enjoy parenting Nate (12) and are members of New Testament Church in Milwaukee where Senior Pastor, Julius Malone, presides.



Many neighbors in the area were curious and sauntered over as the Big Blue Mobile Media van maneuvered into place. They came over to ask questions and found out about the services that ECFA provides locally.

Retired Pastor, Jim Schmitz, was a first year attendee and pleasantly surprised that his name was drawn to win the \$100 first time participant

award. Much to his amazement, he re-connected with his cousin, Gary Gantner, whom he did not expect to be at the same event located over 80 miles from each other's homes. Jim also was able to reunite with Pastor Steve and Linda Carlson friends since the '80's. For the second consecutive year, Linda had the most sponsors, 28 (not including the top three fundraisers). She won two Country Springs Waterpark passes due to the extra generosity of Nancy and Jill from the beautiful Country Springs Hotel.

One young man who was already riding on the Glacial Drumlin Trail was kindly greeted by veteran crossing guard, Ron Baer. This allowed the program and prize drawings to take place in Becca's absence.

The Wisconsin PSS Team Wins!

A number of months ago before reaching a milestone birthday, Amy Miura felt excited that God was prompting her to make some bold changes in her life that included relocating to Wisconsin, looking for a new job, and trusting Him in deeper ways.

At the same time, the PSS program was in search of two full-time birthparent workers which was also posted on the Wheaton website. Amy knew that a lot of social work jobs were available in Milwaukee; but nothing seemed to stimulate her passion to work with "the broken" as she truly desired until calling ECFA Wisconsin for an interview. The words from Linda conveying the reality of working with the broken were what she needed to hear.

Amy earned her Bachelor of Science from Cedarville University where she majored in social work. She was certified in Ohio as a social worker and licensed as a substitute teacher and domestic violence provider in Illinois. She has already become licensed in Wisconsin after successfully completing the state licensure exam on the first try.

Since graduating, she has worked with the broken in many diverse settings that include: at-risk school settings, family shelter counseling, human trafficked individuals, mentally ill youth in Ohio, home support for autistic clients, summer camps in Michigan, foster home youth in Ohio, and youth camps in Illinois. "All of these situations and personal stories shared by clients, have prepared me for the uniqueness of this position. I enjoy meeting and connecting with people in the community so I know what resources will be available for my clients and the specific needs they may have."



Amy was able to find an apartment near the agency with hospitable tenants and morning glories that greet her on sunny days as she walks to her car. Amy thinks that the congested zoo interchange is a breeze compared to her former hour commute to work.

We are delighted to have this Illinois (yes, a Cub fan through and through) with us as she has already blessed the staff with her sweet spirit.

A warm southern accent, coupled with a sweet "yes ma'am" smile, are two obvious identifiers of birth parent caseworker Alycia (with a "y") Johnson. Alycia lived in Kentucky near her grandparents and some family, the last two years while attending Asbury University and earning her Master's Degree in Social Work. Simultaneously, Alycia was employed as a residential Night Youth Care Worker at a maternity home for 11-21 year olds for two years. Her previous experiences as an intern in Wisconsin and Kentucky provided opportunities to work with a variety of ages and races of women and men experiencing unplanned pregnancies or who were in the throes of parenting in dysfunctional settings.

Four years ago, Alycia applied for a PSS internship at ECFA and the relationship with her began. She attended a Fall Banquet and knew this was a place that she connected heart to heart. Although the internship parameters of her school were not a good fit for acceptance at ECFA, Alycia continued to work elsewhere with individuals in unplanned pregnancies in a variety of settings, pursuing her passion to serve others and promote life.

Ironically, the week before she began employment in the PSS program on May 26, 2015, one of our youngest clients had personally requested services. Alycia was able to accompany Linda to meet her for the first visit and has been able to build a relationship and trust with her the past few months.

As Alycia acclimates to Wisconsin, she has been able to enjoy time with her parents and sister and welcomed a new puppy, "Wyatt," into her life and pet-friendly apartment. Alycia attends Oak Creek Assembly and is



excited to see God continue to direct all her days.






DearLOIS

AN ADOPTION JOURNEY MUST READ

How often have you heard people say, "You should write a book."? In Karen Schlindwein's life, this question, became a reality in May 2015 as the first shipment of Dear LOIS paperbacks arrived in boxes. Karen's writing ability began years ago when,



through a series of circumstances, she and her husband Tom, began the adoption journey. Their first child, Amalie, was born and placed with them only16 days after meeting Lois, Amalie's birthmother. The next years were filled with many milestones in Amalie's life that were carefully captured in letters and photos that were carefully mailed on to Lois and her other two children.

A few years later, Tom and Karen had adopted a second time, Joe, also as an infant whose birthmother is Ruth. Letters and photos were also shared with Ruth through the years.

On the book cover, the summary of this beautiful story reads as follows:

Dear Lois is a unique perspective of an adoption journey told through letters written to birthmothers, by the adoptive parents, as their children were growing up. The perspectives of the birth family, adoptive family, and adopted children take the reader on an emotional journey from the heartbreak of a couple facing infertility to the joy of family woven together.

This tender story has many contributors in addition to the main authors, Karen and daughter Amalie Bowling, which makes it so appealing to all members of the adoption triad. Amalie and her husband, Jason, have a desire to use the proceeds from the sale of this book to fund a ministry called "Chosen". This three-fold ministry will be comprised of 1) a residential foster home that will provide hope and encouragement to children that are hurting and broken, 2) connect and facilitate healthy relationships among triad members ~ adoptive parents with birth parents and the children, and 3) educate community members about adoption through programs at churches, schools, and other venues. All the families involved in the 155 pages of this unique book, have grown even closer together. For each, God has revealed so many things through the unexpected challenges in life so that hopefully even more lives will be "regenerated."

Food for Thought at Mayfair Mall?

On July 1st, targeted PSS advertising at Mayfair Mall began as a six month pilot program in the Food Court area. Shopping center stats indicate that an average of 1.8 million people visit that mall each month. A smaller number of that total find their way to the 13 vendors in that Food Court area.

Beginning on July 1, 2015, a trial six month contract was signed with Don, of smartlite, in Boca Raton, Florida. The goal is to promote the PSS Program on a large rotating column that completes a 360 degree turn every 40 seconds to diners in the court. There is also a holder attached that can hold 95 PSS brochures for those interested in more information. It is replenished weekly by Amy and Alycia who are also trying to connect with the vendors who view the advertisement hundreds of times daily and will hopefully refer others they may know. The design was recreated by our own talented Beth Ramsey, who accepted the dimensional challenges.

Two of the months of this advertising are being covered by a generous grant received from Holy Apostles Church in New Berlin. This advertising is costly at \$495 per month but it is hopeful that it will reach future clients with life-valuing options. As a non-profit, we have the option of continuing the advertising beyond December 31, 2015, for an additional six months.
